Cleveland Architecture Walking Tour

Highlights from Public Square to Playhouse Square and everything in between. Cleveland, like much of the east coast, is steeped with history. As we journey, we discuss the Old Stone Church, Terminal Tower, the Soldiers and Sailors Monument, the Cleveland Public Library, the Federal Reserve of Cleveland, and Playhouse Square, with visits inside the Arcade, Library, Terminal Tower, Soldiers and Sailors Monument and Cleveland Trust Company Building (Heinen's). Get your picture under the world's largest permanent outdoor Chandelier.

We visit the six neoclassic buildings of the Grand Plan laid out by Daniel Burnham in 1903 - The Federal Building (1910, now the Howard Metzenbaum US Courthouse), the Cuyahoga County Courthouse (1911), City Hall (1916), Public Auditorium (1922), the Cleveland Public Library (1926) and the Board of Education Building (1930).

We will end the tour with Afternoon Refreshments under an 85-foot-high rotunda topped with tiffany style stained glass dome in the Cleveland Trust Rotunda Building now home to Heinen's.
