

Maltz Museum

The afternoon will begin with a guided tour of their permanent exhibit, Lessons of the Holocaust. This tour explores how a long history of antisemitism, economic turmoil, and the use of aggressive propaganda led the Nazi party, their collaborators, and everyday people to the state-sponsored annihilation of 6 million Jews and 5.7 million non-Jewish people. A large emphasis of this tour is learning from survivors by exploring different objects they left behind and donated to the museum. It prompts visitors to think of the "lessons" we can take away and apply to our lives today. After a brief break, attendees will then explore their special exhibit, [Girl in the Diary: Searching for Rywka from the Lodz Ghetto](#). The day will end with an Interactive Biography of [Stanley Bernath](#), a great tool for educators and students who are unable to visit a museum or institution.
